Benefits of Having a Mentor

Responsibilities of a Mentee

Responsibilities of a Mentor

- Give your time unselfishly
- Share your knowledge
- Allow sufficient time before the game to fill out a convention card
- Spend time after the game discussing problems & analyzing some of the hands as a learning tool

Designed to encourage play and develop skills as your experience grows, the Marin Unit's bridge mentoring program provides the opportunity for newer players to be paired with a more experienced player at 4 different stages:

Masterpoint Level	Number of Sessions
0 - 30	2
31 - 100	2
101 - 200	2
201 - Life Master	2

Eligibility: Each non Life Master member of Unit 508 is eligible for two mentoring sessions at each of the levels shown above. Mentees may request additional mentoring at any level, but will be expected to pay their mentor's card fees.

2 sessions per level: Players are encouraged to take advantage of the mentoring program at each level of experience. Mentoring sessions may not be carried over into the next tier.

Opportunity to play with many players: A new mentor will be assigned at each level unless the parties agree to continue together.

Mentoring Obligation: Mentees will be required to mentor someone in a lower tier as they gain more experience.

Unit Contribution: The Unit will pay the mentor's card fees for 2 sessions at each level.
